### **YEAR 11**

The next two terms are crucial for Year 11 pupils as they prepare for their GCSE examinations and as they plan their future.

### **EXTERNAL EXAMINATIONS**

Year 11 will be sitting EXTERNAL examinations (which WILL count towards their final grades) during the two terms.

### **CONTROLLED ASSESSMENTS (Coursework)**

Controlled Assessments (previously called coursework) are important in most GCSE subjects. They count between 20% and 60% of the final mark in almost every subject. These are held throughout Years 10 and 11 in various subjects - from first lesson in Year 10 until May in Year 11. Most of these have to be completed within a specific number of hours under the supervision of a teacher - so if your son/daughter is absent from lessons then they will have to catch up, at lunchtime or after school.

### HOMEWORK CLUB

Every Monday and Wednesday from 3:30 to 5:00 there is an opportunity for pupils to stay at school in the Library and Resource Centre to complete work. A member of staff will be available to help them if needed.

Arrangements can be made for your son / daughter to stay in the homework club by contacting the school .

### WORK / COACHING ROOM

Pupils can take the opportunity to work at break / lunch in the Library or the Resource Room. They can also go to room 7 where they can get support from a staff member if they are struggling with their work.

### YOUR SON/DAUGHTER'S PROGRESS

Year 11 pupils will receive a full report by the end of January - if you have any concerns regarding you son/ daughter's progress then please contact us.

### YEAR 11 PARENTS' MEETING (PROGRESS MEETING)

An extra parents' meeting has been arranged for Year 11 on March 22<sup>nd</sup>.

#### NEXT YEAR...

Coleg Meirion-Dwyfor/Menai's prospectus has been handed out to Year 11 pupils last term. A representative from the college will be in school in February to help the pupils complete the application forms. There will also be an opportunity to apply for apprenticeships

In the meantime, if they are unsure about their options, your son/daughter can request an appointment to discuss next year's options with Mrs Nia Parry - the school's Careers Wales Advisor.

## SUPPORTING YOU SON/DAUGHTER WITH SCHOOL WORK

- Show an interest in your child's school work and give support according to what he / she needs. Remember that good attendance is essential.
- Discuss what has been going on every day and how you can help.
- Look at your child's books to understand what work is being done. Help with learning by asking questions about the work.
- Ask about your child's work/homework and set rules regarding its completion.
- Talk with your child about expectations, what are their hopes regarding grades, and where would they like to continue their education/training. Encourage your child to do his best and to aim high.
- Make sure your child has a quiet place to do schoolwork. Try to make sure that things like phones/ computers/television don't disrupt your child doing schoolwork.
- Help your child to organize his/her work, giving enough time for him/her to prepare for tests and examinations.
- Try to understand the importance of controlled assessments and examinations to the structure of the GCSE courses. Make sure you know when there are tests, assessments and examinations.
- Attend parents' meetings to discuss your child's work with the teachers.

## ATTENDANCE

You have received a report on your son/daughter's attendance for last term with the interim report. It gives me pleasure to report that 41% of the pupils missed less than one day of school last term and that 86 pupils didn't miss a single day—well done!

Everyone's target for the year is attendance of at least 96%. This means not missing more than 8 days of school during the year.

# **APPLICATION FOR HOLIDAY FAMILY DURING THE TERM**

Following guidance from the Welsh Government, the County Council has recommended that their schools authorize no more than 5 days holiday / visits for Key Stage 3 (Years 7,8,9) pupils and not to authorize any holiday at Key Stage 4 (Years 10 and 11) during the school term.

We will adhere to this guidance at Ysgol Botwnnog. Any absences outside these limits shall be recorded as unauthorized absence. The Authority's Education Welfare Officer monitors unauthorized absences weekly and if there are 10 or more of them this could result in a fixed penalty notice.

Before going on vacation or other visits during the term parents should contact the Headmaster to receive permission to remove the child from school.

## ABSENCE—INFORMING US

To ensure that everybody who should be in school is present please contact the school on the first morning of absence so that we know if your son / daughter should be here or not.

We ask you to let us know if your son / daughter is absent by calling 01758 730220 between 8:00 and 9:15.

If the school hasn't received a call by 9:15 telling us why your child is not in school, then we will contact your home or workplace.

# ADVERSE WEATHER AND CLOSING SCHOOL

If a situation arises that we have to close school for reasons beyond our control—weather, no electricity or water, etc; we will try to send a text message to every home to inform you. We can text message every home within minutes—so long as we have a valid mobile phone number.

We will also make an announcement on Radio Cymru between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. and on the Council website - <u>www.gwynedd.gov.uk</u>

If we have to close school during the day and have to send pupils home for health and safety reasons we will follow these procedures:-

i. pupils should return home on the school bus (if that is how they come to school)

ii. pupils should then return to their home or the house of a relative or friend (according to your instructions).

# BEHAVIOUR CODE FOR PUPILS TRAVELLING ON SCHOOL BUSES — PART OF A NATIONAL POLICY

Your safety is very important. You must behave responsibly and safely when travelling to and from school or college, whether you go there by bus, train, taxi, bicycle, walking or any other way. If you get a bus to school or college, you must also follow the rules in the School Bus Travel Behaviour Code.

If you do not follow this Code, for your own safety, and other people's, local authorities, schools and colleges can take action against you. This might involve taking away your right to school transport and even excluding you from school.

### School Bus Travel Behaviour Code

- When at the bus stop, always wait sensibly, off the road.
- Make an agreement with your parents what to do if the bus does not arrive or if you miss it.
- When the bus arrives, wait for it to stop. Never push or rush for the door.
- Show your bus pass (if you have been given one) when you get on the bus.
- On a school bus stay in your seat for the whole journey.
- On a public bus find a seat if one is available.
- Never block the aisle with your bag or other belongings.
- Always wear a seatbelt if one is provided.
- You must not distract the driver when he or she is driving.
- Never eat or drink on the bus.
- Never throw anything in or from the bus.
- Never damage or vandalise any part of the bus.
- Never operate the bus doors or exits, except in an emergency.
- Always follow the instructions of the driver or passenger assistant at all times.
- If there is an accident, stay on the bus until you are told to leave. If it is unsafe to stay on the bus then leave by the safest exit.
- Never try and get on or off the bus until it has stopped.
- Always get off the bus sensibly, taking all your belongings with you.
- Never cross the road in front of or close behind the bus.
